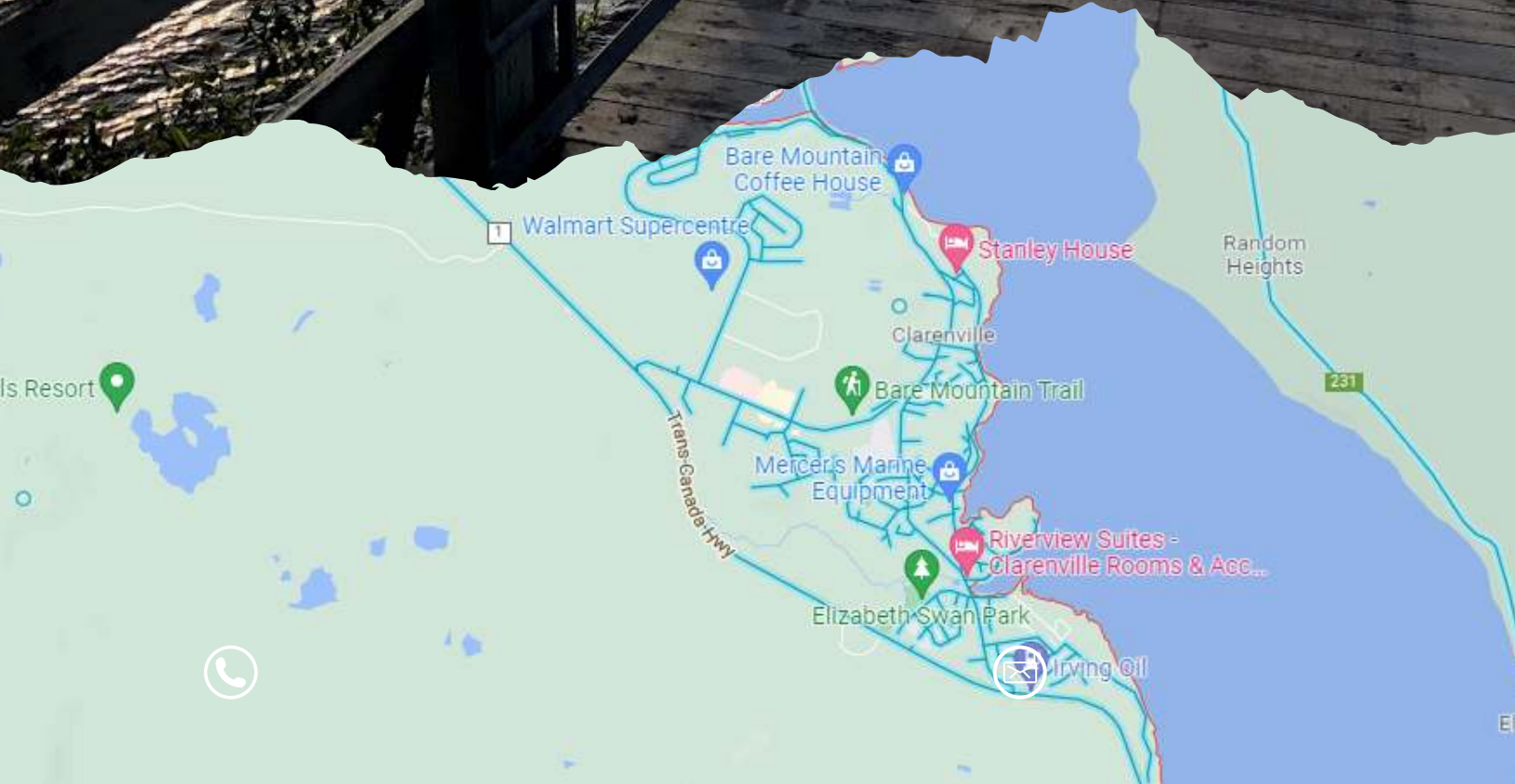

HIKING TRAILS

Clareville

BARE MOUNTAIN TRAIL **MODERATE**

The Bare Mountain Trail is a 3 kilometer loop through lush forests punctuated by rocky promontories. It starts and ends at the Manitoba Professional Building on Manitoba Drive.

PITTMAN POINT TRAIL **(NAKED MAN BEACH)** **MEDIUM**

Most people are aware of the TCH overlook just east of Clareville. From there you can take a path to the beach at Pittmans Point. This well-marked 1.5km trail (one way) skirts along the slope through a rich forest to a beautiful beach - a great spot for a boil-up or beach fire.

ROTARY TRAIL **EASY**

Rotary Trail is a 5 Kilometer lightly trafficked loop that features a waterfall and is good for all skill levels.

SHOAL HARBOUR RIVER **UPPER TRAIL** **EASY**

The Upper Trail is a easy hike with a few muddy sections. The lower trail is more challenging and it does give you more access to the river. 4.3 km out and back.

SHOAL HARBOUR LOOP **EASY**

The Shoal Harbour Trail boasts two viewing decks overlooking random Sound. An asphalt walking trail continues from the pedestrian bridge to Hunts Hill. Picnic tables, benches, flower boxes and hanging baskets have been placed along the loop.

THE WELLNESS TRAIL **MODERATE**

The Wellness Trail has no designated beginning or end. You can start at the High School or the Town Hall or even use it as a bridge between the Rotary Trail and the Bare Mountain Trail. It basically forms a cross pattern tending roughly towards four major compass points.

Clarenville

ISLAND COVE Island Cove is a tiny cove situated on Cormack Drive. This charming site acts as a sanctuary for seagulls, robins, sparrows, Canada geese and greater yellow leg sea birds. Benches and picnic tables are placed in selected areas along the trail to provide an unobstructed view of the ocean, the rock walls, the beaches, and the meadow of natural grasses.

MULTI-USE TRAILS

Clarenville

Clarenville and the surrounding areas offer great year-round opportunities for users of ATVs, snowmobiles and biking to explore and have fun. Clarenville trail connections allow you to access routes in three directions – towards the Bonavista Peninsula as well as east or west to destinations along the provincial t’railway.

CLARENVILLE PERIMETER TOUR

Take a tour around perimeter of Clarenville. This 46km tour brings from Clarenville westward on the T’railway to Trynor’s Pit, around the White Hills Forestry Road, along the LIL power line and back to Clarenville along the Trailway.

CLARENVILLE TO B36 CRASH SITE

In March of 1953, a giant RB36 Peacemaker crashed in the hills above Burgoyne’s Cove killing 23 airmen. The crash site is accessible by a 1.5 km trail. Take a 72 km trail from Clarenville to the trail leading to the Crash site.

THE CORMACK TRAIL LOOP

The 78 km Cormack Trail loop takes you along the Bonavista branch of the former NL railway from Clarenville, along the shores of Smith Sound through Georges Brook/Milton to Lethbridge. From there, the trail heads inland along Sexton’s Road to intersect with the TransCanada Highway and the T’railway at Thorburn Lake

CLARENVILLE TO KEPENKECK LAKE

Travel approximately 110 km route from Clarenville to Terra Nova village and then up through the Terra Nova River valley to Kepenkeck lake.

CLARENVILLE TO TRINITY

This route brings us to the historic and picturesque town of Trinity. This 180 km return trip takes us along the Bonavista branch of the T'railway to Lethbridge, then along forestry roads to Trinity.

CLARENVILLE TO SABENA CRASH SITE

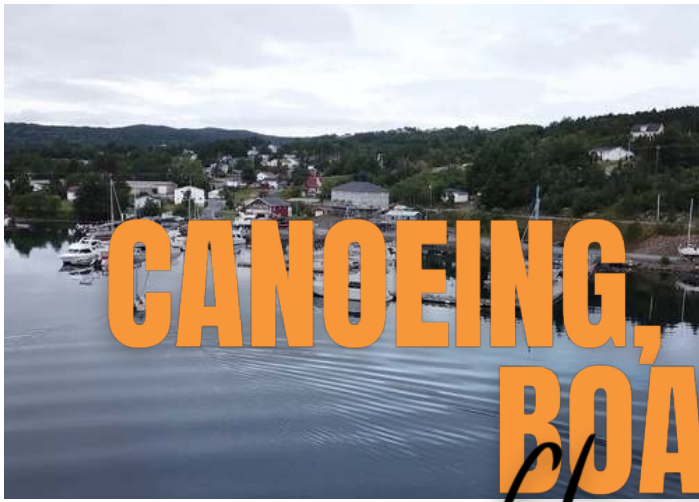
Ride from Clarenville to the Sabena Crash site 3km south of Gander - 135km from Clarenville.

CLARENVILLE TO TERRA NOVA VILLAGE

The 55 km T'railway corridor between Clarenville and the Village of Terra Nova is a popular off-road route for ATVers and bikers. The route extends northwest through the scenic Shoal Harbour valley through the Thorburn lake cottage area, on to Port Blandford and the popular Terra Nova Golf resort, across the Southwest river and inland to the picturesque Terra Nova village.

CLARENVILLE TO SOUTHWEST RIVER FALLS

The Southwest river flows from through a valley west of Thorburn Lake and empties into the sea at Port Blandford. The Southwest River Falls is a hidden gem that is located approximately 8 km up from the river's mouth. You can hike to the falls starting at the Labrador Island Link Power Line (LIL) near Thorburn Lake.

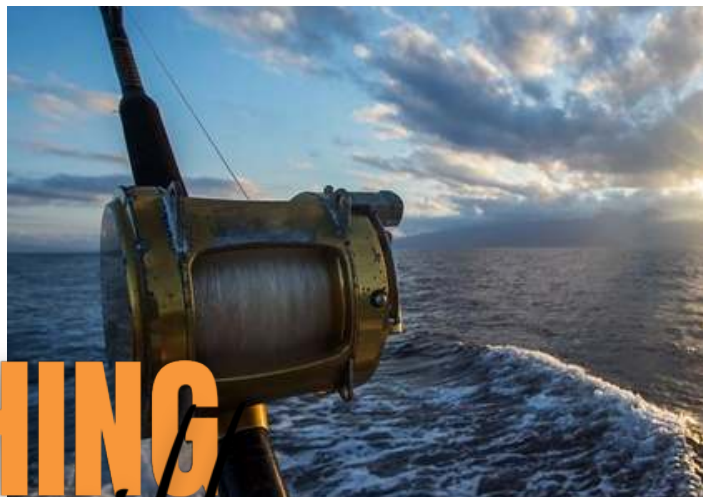
SHOAL HARBOUR SHREDDER Shoal Harbour Shredder is a 430 m less popular blue singletrack trail located near Clareville Newfoundland. This mountain bike primary trail can be used downhill primary. On average it takes 2 minutes to complete this trail.

SHOAL HARBOUR EXPRESS Shoal Harbour Express is a 446 m moderately popular blue single track trail located near Clareville Newfoundland. This mountain bike primary trail can be used downhill primary. On average it takes 2 minutes to complete this trail.

CLIMB BACK TO DOG PARK Climb Back to Dog Park is a 744 m popular green wilderness trail located near Clareville Newfoundland. This mountain bike primary trail can be used downhill primary and has a moderate overall physical rating with a 8 m blue climb. On average it takes 4 minutes to complete this trail.

**GRAVEL PIT TO DARK HOLE
BROOK BRIDGE** Gravel Pit to Dark Hole Brook Bridge is a 578 m moderately popular green gravel path trail located near Clareville Newfoundland. This mountain bike primary trail can be used both directions and has a easy overall physical rating with a 14 m green climb. On average it takes 4 minutes to complete this trail.

**ELIZABETH SWAN TO DOG
PARK LOOP ACCESS** Elizabeth Swan to Dog Park Loop Access is a 117 m popular green single track trail located near Clareville Newfoundland. This mountain bike primary trail can be used both directions and has a easy overall physical rating with a 0 m green climb. On average it takes minutes to complete this trail



FISHING *Clarenville*

SHOAL HARBOUR RIVER Shoal Harbour River flows into Newfoundland's eastern shore at the community of Clarenville. This is one of the better rivers for sea-run rainbow trout. Anglers are best advised to concentrate their efforts around the estuary using lures that resemble salmon roe.

OCEAN FISHING Experience a day on the ocean like never before. Clarenville, located on the shore of Shoal Harbour, can be used as a base to fish for Atlantic salmon and cod.

JACK'S POND Located just off the Trans-Canada Highway 50 km south of Clarenville, this pond offers a place to fish for trout and canoe.

Clarenville

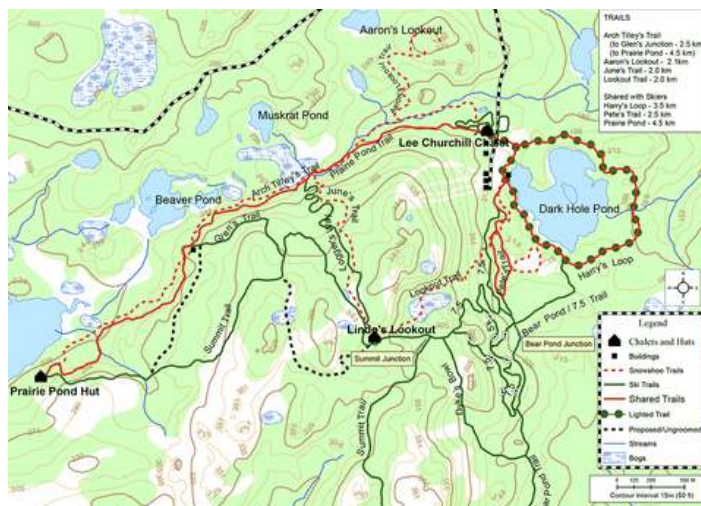


CLARENVILLE NORDIC SKI CLUB
